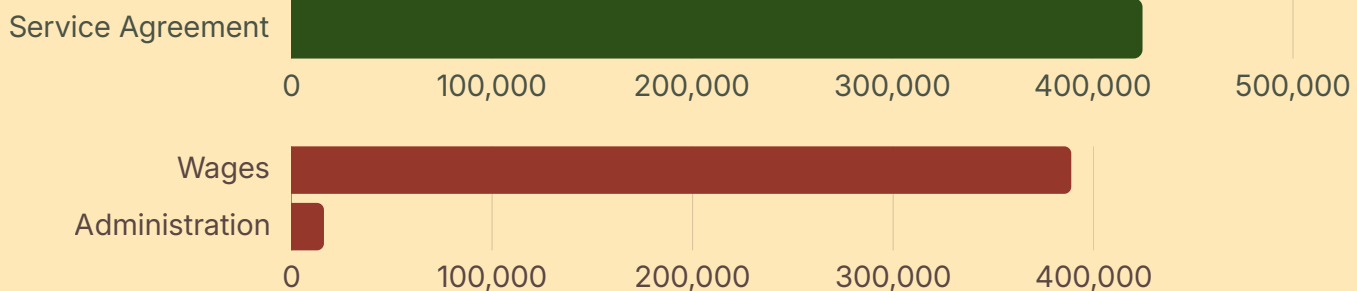

a year in review

This year, the Friends of Reynolds-Alberta Museum Society invested in programming, education, vehicle restoration, and community engagement.

The Society remained financially stable through our Service Agreement with the Government of Alberta, allowing us to confidently fund programs, restoration projects, and other priorities that directly benefit the Museum. We were also pleased to receive funding through the Canada Summer Jobs grant to bolster seasonal staffing during the Museum's busiest months.

To strengthen our long-term sustainability, the Society launched a new website, welcomed a new Board member representing the County of Wetaskiwin, and established Fundraising and Policy Committees to enhance governance.

A significant milestone this year was the completion of our AGLC casino fundraiser. Thanks to the dedication of six volunteers who contributed two days and two nights of service, the event raised approximately \$30,000 to advance the Society's mission.

Looking ahead, The Friends will continue expanding fundraising opportunities, building new partnerships, and working collaboratively with the Government of Alberta to ensure our Service Agreement continues to meet the evolving needs of the Reynolds Museum. With a strong foundation in place, we remain committed to enriching visitor experiences and helping the Museum thrive for years to come.
